31. COURSE OUTCOME: POLITICAL SCIENCE

COURSE OUTCOMES

CC-I: <u>Understanding Political Theory</u>

This course is divided into two sections. 'A' introduces the students to the idea of political theory, its history and approaches. 'B' is designed to reconcile political theory and practices through reflections on the ideas and practices related to democracy.

CC-II: Constitutional Government and Democracy of India

This course acquaints the students with the constitutional design of state structures and institutions and their actual working overtime. The Indian constitution accommodates conflicting impulses within itself. The course stresses the embodiment of some of these conflicts in constitutional provisions and shows how those have played out political practice.

CC-III: Political Theory- Concerns and Debates

This course is divided into two sections. Section: A helps the students familiarise with the basic normative concepts of political theory. Each concept is related to a crucial political issue that requires analysis with the aid of any conceptual understanding. Section: B introduces the students to the important debates in the subject.

CC-IV: Political Process in India

This course maps the working of modern institutions, promised on the existence of an individualised society in a context marked by communication solidarities and their mutual transformation thereby. It also familiarises students with the working of the Indian state paying attention to the contradictory dynamics of modern state power.

CC-V: Introduction to Comparative Government and Politics

The purpose is to familiarise students with the basic concepts and approaches to the study of comparative politics. More specifically the course will focus on examining politics in a historical framework while engaging with various themes of comparative analysis in developed and developing countries.

CC-VI: Introduction to Public Administration

This paper encompasses public administration in its historical context with an emphasis on the various classical and contemporary administrative theories. The course also explores some of the recent trends including feminism and ecological conservation and how the call for greater democratisation is restructuring public administration. The course will also attempt to provide the studentsa comprehensive understanding on contemporary administrative developments.

CC-VII: Perspectives of International Relations

This paper seeks to equip students with the basic intellectual tools for understanding international relations. It introduces students of some of the most important theoretical approaches for studying international relations. A key objective of the course is to make students aware of the implicit Eurocentrism of international relations by highlighting certain specific perspectives from the Global South.

CC-VIII: Political Process and Institutions in Comparative Perspective

In this course students will be trained in the application of comparative methods to the study of politics. The course aims to introduce undergraduate student to some of the range of issues, literature and methods that cover comparative political.

CC-IX: Public Policy and Administration in India

The paper seeks to provide an introduction to the interface between public policy and administration in India. It deals with issues of decentralisation, financial management, citizens and administration and social welfare from a non-western perspective.

CC-X: Global Politics

This course introduces students to the key debates on the meaning and nature of globalisation by addressing its political, economic, social, cultural and technological dimensions. The course also offers insights into key contemporary global issues, international terrorism and human security before concluding with a debate on the phenomenon of global governance.

CC-XI: Western Political Philosophy

This course goes back to Greek antiquity and familiarises students with the manner in which the political questions were first posed. Machiavelli comes as an interlude inaugurating modern politics followed by Hobbes and Locke, Rousseau, Marx. This is a basic foundation course for students.

CC-XII: Indian Political Thought (Ancient and Medieval)

The course as a whole is meant to provide a sense of the broad streams of Indian thought while encouraging a specific knowledge of individual thinkers and texts. Selected extracts from some original texts are also given to discuss in class.

CC-XIII: Contemporary Political Philosophy

Philosophy and politics are closely intertwined. Students will be exposed to the manner in which the questions of politics have been posed in terms that have implications for larger questions of thought and existence.

CC-XIV: Modern Indian Political Thought

The course introduces a wide span of thinkers and themes that defines the modernity of Indian political thought. The objective is to study general themes that have been produced by thinkers from varied social and temporal contexts.

DSE-I: Introduction to Human Rights

This course attempts to build an understanding of human rights among students through a study of specific issues in a comparative perspective. It is important for students to see how debates on human rights have been distinct forms historically and in the contemporary world. The course seeks to anchor all issues in the Indian context and pulls out another country to form a broader comparative frame.

DSE-II: Development process and Social Movements in Contemporary India.

This Course proposes to introduce students to the conditions, context and forms of Political contestation over development paradigms & their bearing on the retrieval of Democratic voice of Citizens.

DSE-III: Indians foreign policy in a changing world.

The courses object is to teach students democratic sources and structural constraints on the genesis, evolution and practice of India's foreign policy. The endeavour is to highlight unique linkages between the domestic and international aspects India's foreign policy by stressing on the shifts in its democratic international level.

DSE-IV: Research Projects.

The Research experience of students is greatly enriched by early exposures to conducting research. There are numerous benefits of undergraduate students who get involved in research. They are better off in understanding published works, determine an area of interest, can discover their passion for research and may start their career as a researcher. Further, students will be able to develop ability for scientific inquiry and critical thinking ability.
